The minor in Leadership Studies requires 18 semester hours, 13 of which must be from 300-400 level courses. 9 hours of upper division work must be taken in residence at WSU or through WSU approved education abroad or educational exchange courses. Students must earn credits from courses in the core curriculum and the supporting interdisciplinary curriculum approved for the minor. Students must complete 9 and no more than 12 core curriculum credits from the following: 6 credits from: Ed Ad 389, 440; 3 credits from: either Ed Ad 497, 498, or 499. In addition to the 9 credits from the core curriculum, students must earn the balance of the 18 credits from courses listed in the interdisciplinary supporting curriculum; choose 9 credits from: CES 301, 335, 495, ComSt 185, 235, 302, 334, 475, H D 205, Mgt 401, 450, Pol S 455, 456, W St 315.
