---REQUIREMENTS---
The requirements listed below reflect the undergraduate major curricular changes approved by the Catalog Subcommittee since approval of the last Undergraduate Major Change Bulletin. All curricula are printed in their entirety under the headings Current and Proposed, respectively. The column to the far right indicates the date each change becomes effective.

Students seeking a college of Business minor must take at least 9 of the required hours at the 300-400-level in residence at WSU or through WSUapproved education abroad or educational exchange courses. A maximum of 6 hours may be transferred from another institution. | management requires a minimum of 19 hours, 9 of which must be 300-400 level with an overall gpa of at least a 2.5 in the required courses. The required courses are Acctg 230, HBM 182 or 320 [Industry Experience which requires students to fulfill a 400 hour work experience/internship and 5 College of Business or Hospitality Business Management courses of which at least nine hours must be Hospitality Business Management courses at the 300-400 level. $300-400$ level courses must be taken in residence at WSU or though WSUapproved education abroad or educational exchange courses and they may not include any 498 or 499 courses. Up to 6 hours may be transferred from another institution. Students must ensure that they meet all course prerequisites before seeking admission to any College of Business course. |  |
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| Hospitality Business Management, revise certification requirements for HBM | To be eligible for certification as a major in hospitality business management, students must have earned at least 60 semester hour of credit and completed the following certification courses with a gpa of 2.50 or higher: Acctg 230, 231; B Law 210; MgtOp 215; EconS 101, 102; Engl 101; Math 201, Math 202 or 205; MIS 250, and have a WSU cumulative gpa of 2.5 . All students must apply for certification on-line. Students will also be ranked based on space availability and academic performance. Students are eligible to petition for consideration of alternative criteria. | To be eligible for certification as a major in hospitality business management, students must have earned at least 60 semester hour of credit and completed the following certification courses with a gpa of 2.50 or higher: Acctg 230, 231; B Law 210; MgtOp 215; EconS 101, 102; Engl 101; Math 201, Math 202; MIS 250, and have a WSU cumulative gpa of 2.5 . All students must apply for certification online. Students will also be ranked based on space availability and academic performance. The miner in Leadership-Studies requires 18 semester hours, 13 of which must be from 300-400-level courses. 9 hours of upper division work must be taken in residence at WSU or through WSU approved education abroad or edueational exchange courses. Students must earn eredits from courses in the core curriculum and the supporting interdisciplinary eurriculum approved for the minor. Students must complete 9 and no more than 12 core eurriculum credits from the following: 6 eredits from: Ed Ad 389, 440; 3 credits from: either Ed Ad-497, 498, or 499.Im addition to the 9 credits from the core eurriculum, students must earn the balance of the 18 credits from courses listed in the interdiseiplinary supporting eurrieulum; ehoose 9 credits from: CES 301, 335, 495, ComSt 185, 235, 302, 334, 475, HD 205, Mgt 401, 450, Pol S 455, 456, W St 315.
